- Founded 1870 as the Missouri School of Mines
- Became the University of Missouri-Rolla (UMR) in 1964 and Missouri S&T in 2008
- 284-acre campus located in Rolla, Mo., a town of 18,000 in the beautiful Ozark Mountains
- First U.S. university to attain ISO 14001 certification for environmental management

Enrollment

- 7,200 total students
- 5,500 undergraduates and 1,700 graduate students
- Students are from 50 states and 51 foreign countries
- New student class – 1,000 freshmen and 300 transfer
- 70% from Missouri

Undergraduate Population

- 23% female, 77% male
- 10% minority
- 3% international

Faculty

- Approximately 400 faculty
- 99% of full-time tenured and tenure-track faculty have Ph.D.s or the highest degree awarded in their field

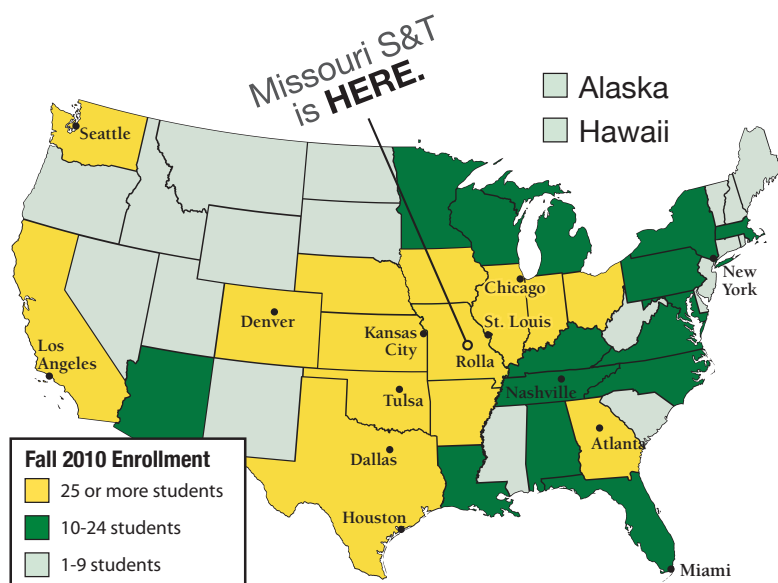

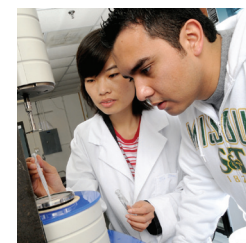
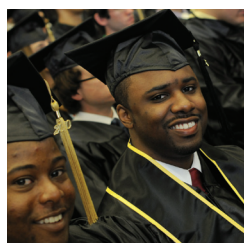


Distance from:
