Undergraduate Tuition and Fee Schedule:

Detailed explanations of fees are outlined at cashier.mst.edu. Most fees are assessed on a per credit hour basis unless otherwise noted.

- **Tuition (varies by state of residency)**
 - Missouri Resident: \$269.40 per credit hour
 - Out-of-State Resident: \$746.60 per credit hour
 - S&T's Residency Policy is available at registrar.mst.edu.
- **Activity Facility Fee: \$33.65 per credit hour (maximum charge of \$345.50 after 10 credit hours)**
 - The Activity Facility Fee is voted on and approved by the student body and allocates money to student organizations and activities. This fee also allows students access to the Recreation and Fitness Center and free admission to home athletic contests. For specific allotments visit stuco.mst.edu/safb.
- **Health Service Fee: \$92.00 per academic semester**
 - The Health Service Fee allows students access to the Student Health Center and a doctor or nurse practitioner Monday–Friday, 8:00AM–5:00PM. For more information visit studenthealth.mst.edu.
- **Information Technology Fee: \$13.40 per credit hour**
 - The Information Technology Fee allows a student access to Computer Learning Centers, teaching technology, tech support, e-mail, file storage and similar resources. For specific allotments visit it.mst.edu.
- **Supplemental Course Fees apply for the following:**
 - Engineering fee of \$74.20 per credit hour charged to students enrolled in Engineering courses.
 - Science fee of \$72.20 per credit hour charged to students enrolled in Biological Sciences and Chemistry courses.
 - Science fee of \$70.90 per credit hour charged to students enrolled in Computer Science and Geology & Geophysics courses.
 - Science fee of \$35.40 per credit hour charged to students enrolled in Physics courses.
 - Business fee of \$36.10 per credit hour charged to students enrolled in Business & Management Systems, Information Science & Technology, and Management & Information Systems courses.
 - Co-listed courses are charged the higher of applicable fees.

Courses audited or taken at reduced credit will be counted at their normal credit value. S&T's refund policy is available at sfa.mst.edu.

The University reserves the right to modify by increase or decrease the tuition and fees charged for attendance and other services to the University, including but not limited to tuition, at any time when in the discretion of the governing board the same is in the best interest of the University, provided that no increases can or will be effective unless approved by the Curators of the University of Missouri not less than thirty days prior to the beginning of the academic term (semester, etc.) to which the fees are applicable, with all modification of fees to be effective irrespective as to whether fees have or have not been paid by on or behalf of a student prior to the effective date of the modification.

Scholarships and financial assistance help **YOU** meet costs!

Scholarships at Missouri S&T are many and varied. Some of the most prestigious scholarships are awarded early, allowing Missouri S&T to send out individual financial assistance awards to students in late December.

To apply for merit-based awards:

- Submit an application for admission online at apply.mst.edu before the December 1 priority application date.

To apply for need-based federal and most state aid:

- Complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). Priority for most programs given to students submitting the FAFSA by March 1.

While there are no true deadlines for need-based aid, early FAFSA submission is encouraged. First consideration for certain limited programs is given to those students submitting the FAFSA in January and February. Students applying any other time of the year will be awarded on a funds-available basis.

All students are strongly encouraged to complete the FAFSA to determine their eligibility for federal financial aid.

Dates to remember for incoming first-time freshmen:

December 1: Priority Application Deadline for Admission and Scholarships.

Scholarships are awarded on a funds-available basis after December 1.

Rolling applications for admission will be accepted and reviewed until July 1.

March 1: Priority deadline to complete a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) at fafsa.gov to qualify for need-based assistance and non-need based educational loans.

Early April: Final scholarship and financial assistance award letters are mailed to students.

Late June: Information on first bill sent to students' Missouri S&T email address.

July 15: First payment due for fall semester.
