

# freshman admission

Missouri S&T has generous scholarships for entering freshmen. To apply for admission and scholarships, submit an Undergraduate Application for Admission and Scholarships online at **apply.mst.edu** by the **priority deadline of December 1**. An application, application fee (\$45), official high school and/or college transcripts and standardized test score (ACT or SAT) must be submitted. Applications submitted after December 1 will be considered for scholarships on a funds-available basis. *Applicants can request a paper Application for Admission by calling the Admissions Office at 800-522-0938 or 573-341-4165.* 

Transcripts and test scores will not be accepted from the applicant. Request that your high school and/or college transcript be sent directly to:

Test scores are evaluated based on a student's highest composite score from ACT or SAT and should be sent directly from the testing agency.

#### **Admission Requirements**

Missouri S&T admits students who have a strong probability of succeeding at the university. Admission is based on a combination of high school core curriculum, standardized test scores (ACT or SAT) and class rank percentile. Students who attend non-ranking high schools are evaluated for admission based on their GPA in combination with their test scores.

#### **High School Core Curriculum**

Students planning to attend S&T should follow a college preparatory curriculum completing at least 17 units of credit (one unit = one year in class). Applicants lacking any core requirements will be reviewed on an individual basis.

- English: 4 units, one of which may be in speech or debate. Two units emphasizing composition or writing skills are required. Acceptable courses may be English 9, 10, 11, 12; Literature; Speech; Debate; Journalism; etc.
- Mathematics: 4 units (Algebra I and higher). Acceptable courses may be
- Algebra I, Algebra II/Intermediate Algebra, Geometry, Trigonometry, Calculus, Math Analysis, etc. • Social Studies: 3 units. Acceptable courses may be World History, American
- History, Government, Principles of Democracy, etc.
  Science: 3 units, one of which must be a laboratory course.
- Acceptable courses may be Biology, Earth Science, Chemistry, Physics, etc.
- Fine Arts: 1 unit. Acceptable courses may be Visual Arts, Music, Theater, Painting/Drawing, etc.
- Foreign language: 2 units (same language).

Missouri S&T considers credits in the same manner that local school districts organize their coursework. For example, if a high school considers a course as a "science" credit, S&T will honor that designation by considering the same course as a "science" requirement.

Applicants who do not meet published admission requirements automatically receive a comprehensive review that considers the rigor of the curriculum and any extenuating circumstances mentioned in accompanying essay or letter of recommendation (if submitted with Application for Admission).
