Economics is the study of how individuals allocate resources for production in order to satisfy their human needs and wants. This focus on the human condition places economics firmly into the social sciences arena; however, the application of economic principles to problems of choice in markets and financial decision-making also gives economics a central role in the theory of business management.

Economics majors learn the tools for making efficient decisions in a broad range of areas while studying many of the concepts of microeconomics and macroeconomics. Economics may be the best suited for you if your interests lie in the areas of:

- International trade and payments
- Government Policies
- Inflation and unemployment
- Market Failures and Price discrimination

Virtually all business degrees were derived from the study of economics. Marketing, management, finance, and even accounting are based on an understanding of economics and almost always require substantial coursework in the field. The economics program at Missouri S&T offers students an opportunity to study in a setting designed to produce maximum learning.

Many economics students are pursuing dual-degrees and studying engineering, science, business or mathematics as well. Economics is exciting in itself but can be a nice complement to any other course of study.
