# Psychology Department of Psychological Science

Psychology is the scientific study of behavior and cognitive processes. This includes how humans grow and develop as individuals and as members of groups, organizations, and society. Psychology students learn how to collect, analyze, and interpret data, while developing writing and presentation skills that are useful in a variety of professions. At the Missouri S&T Department of Psychological Science you will learn about the many diverse areas of psychology and have the flexibility to tailor your degree to fit your particular interests. The department offers a Bachelor of Arts and Bachelor of Science degree as well as certification from the State of Missouri to teach in secondary schools.

A degree in psychology fits many interests that include:

- Learning, cognitive psychology, or neuroscience
- Sensation and perception
- Social, developmental, abnormal, or personality psychology
- Clinical or counseling psychology
- Educational psychology or psychometrics
- Industrial or organizational psychology
- Human-computer interaction, human factors or ergonomics

Missouri S&T's innovative psychology curriculum and a 10:1 ratio of students-to-faculty in the department allows psychology majors to benefit from personal attention and small classes. In addition, undergraduate students participate in research which often results in a student conference presentation but can also result in co-authorship with faculty at professional meetings or in refereed journal articles.

#### Student Organizations and Undergraduate Research

Psychology students at Missouri S&T have the opportunity to participate in undergraduate research through the Opportunities for Undergraduate Research Program or participate in faculty research projects. They may also enter in the annual Undergraduate Research Conference held each spring. Psychology majors and minors can join the Missouri S&T chapter of Psi Chi Society, a National Honor Society in Psychology.

#### **Scholarship Information**

Freshman scholarships are automatically awarded based on high school transcripts and ACT/SAT scores. No separate application is necessary. Scholarships for sophomores, juniors and seniors typically require an application and are based on academic record, service activities and extracurricular activities.
